



FREE EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS TRAINING

2015 Fall Session Begins Thursday, September 10th from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m.

Following a major disaster, first responders who provide fire and medical services may not be able to meet these demands. People will have to rely on each other for help in order to meet their immediate life-saving and life-sustaining needs.

The CERT program educates people about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact the Charlottesville/Albemarle area and trains them in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations.

Level 1: Thursday, September 10th

Take your first steps to becoming a member of the CERT community by orienting yourself to:

- ✓ Regional hazards
- ✓ Personal preparedness
- ✓ Elements of fire safety
- ✓ Elements of medical operations



Become an asset to your community by developing the foundational skills necessary for emergency response.

Level 2: September 17th-October 29th

After completing the level one course, become a practitioner of primary emergency response skills such as:

- ✓ Team organization
- ✓ Basic search & rescue
- ✓ Fire safety/Basic Medical Operations
- ✓ Disaster psychology



The level 2 course will expand and cement your emergency response abilities to become a fully trained CERT volunteer.
