

For over fifty years, our Educational Leadership and Policy Studies Program has prepared aspiring educational administrators throughout the Commonwealth. Graduates leave with the skills they need to lead ethically; advance equity and social justice in educational settings; consider and implement educational policy; lead innovative practices; communicate with diverse constituents; and improve the learning and well-being of all PK-12 students. Currently, approximately 30% of division superintendents in Virginia are graduates of Virginia Tech's Educational Leadership programs.

RIGOROUS, RESPECTED APPROACH

Our program is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, and is approved by the Virginia Department of Education. Virginia Tech is a member of the University Council for Educational Administration.

Our doctoral students complete 69 credits of coursework, and typically transfer in 30 credits from their master's program. The degree may be completed in three years, though some students take additional semesters to complete their dissertations. The dissertation demonstrates the student's ability to investigate a practical issue in educational administration.

Do you think the VT Educational Leadership Doctoral Program may be right for you? To be admitted as a doctoral student, you must:

- · Hold a master's-level degree in Education Administration and Supervision from an accredited institution
- · Have earned at least a 3.3 GPA on your most recent graduate coursework
- · Have served or currently serve in an educational leadership position

Applicants are evaluated based on their written and oral communication skills; letters of recommendation; and commitment both to completing the program and to continuing their service as educational leaders.
